mark that I am desiring. However, mysticism and superstition in numbers is a continuous fad among mankind.

One well-known person that joined in the Y2K madness was a man by the name of Hal Lindsey. He was and is well-known because the year 2000 was not his first prediction. He originally "prophesied" that 1988 was the year of the end of the world, which meant that the "rapture" was to come in 1981. The "rapture" did not take *him* in 1981, and the earth remains now 23 years after the "end of the world". His next "end of the world" prediction was 2007, making 2000 the year in which the "rapture was to come". Both years have come and gone, and yet people still listen to this blaspheming false prophet. It is astounding to me that Hal Lindsey still has followers after his many false predictions. Notice this brief information provided by *Wikipedia*:

In *The Late, Great Planet Earth*, Lindsey wrote that he had concluded, since there was no apparent mention of the United States of America in the books of Daniel or Revelation, that the USA would no longer be a major player on the geo-political stage by the time the tribulations of the end times arrived. Lindsey also interpreted from Revelation and prophetic texts that the European Economic Community, which preceded the European Union, was destined (according to Biblical prophecy) to become a "United States of Europe", with ten members, which in turn he says is destined to become a "Revived Roman Empire" ruled by the Antichrist. The European Union currently has 27 members.

A later book, bearing the title *The 1980s: Countdown to Armageddon*, implied that the battle of Armageddon would take place in the not too distant future, stating "the decade of the 1980s could very well be the last decade of history as we know it"[7] and that the U.S. could be "destroyed by a surprise Soviet nuclear attack."[8] The book strongly suggests that the 1980s would see the biblical events of tribulation and end times come to pass.

Planet Earth - 2000 A.D., published in the early 1990s, states that Christians should not plan to still be on earth by the year 2000.

Today, the craze primarily surrounds the year 2012. The "evidence" resides in the "Mayan calendar". Ronald Weinland boldly states that the end is coming on May 21, 2012, while others claim, based on the Mayan calendar, that the last day is December 21 or 23, 2012, depending upon which article you read on the subject. Furthermore, in 2010, a movie based upon the aforementioned prediction was released with the title 2012, in which the producers depicted their idea of the end of the world.

Dear friends, we have got to stop looking to Hollywood and start looking to Heaven! We must stop listening to the false prophets and start listening to the Father! We need to decrease our study of Bible "scholars" and increase our study of the Bible! Jesus said, *Heaven and earth shall*

pass away, but my words shall not pass away. But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no, not the angels of heaven, but my Father only (Matt. 24:35, 36). The Apostle Peter wrote: But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. The same was affirmed by the Apostle Paul: For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. How often does a thief give the victim the exact date and time that he plans to burglarize him?

Some may say: "Ok, we cannot know the exact time of His return, but it must be soon because of the wars and rumours of wars (Matt. 24:6), the famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes (24:7), and the false prophets (24:11), and the false Christs (24:24), and the other 'signs' in Matthew 24 that are indicative of what is happening today!" Such a statement is a clear misunderstanding of the context of Matthew 24:1-34, and the fact that verses 35 and following are a different context. A careful study of Matthew 24:1-34 and the history shortly following the years after these prophecies will confirm that the things found therein said by Jesus were referencing the destruction of the Jerusalem temple in A.D. 70. While I cannot completely vouch for his entire website (www.padfield.com), David Padfield has prepared great material from historical documents that are great possibilities in explaining and showing the fulfillment of many of the things mentioned in Matthew 24:1-34. Flavius Josephus' historical writings have been very helpful in the understanding of many things surrounding, preceding, and following the life of Christ and the establishment of the church; however, Padfield includes other historical writings as well.

WHEN WILL THE WORLD COME TO AN END? When the Father tells the Son, "It is finished". *Of that day and hour knoweth no man* (Matt. 24:36). But when Jesus does return, those that have lived their lives in obedience to God will have the assurance of knowing, *so shall we ever be with the Lord* (1 Thess. 4:17).
